December 22, 2014 at approximately 1935 hours

On 12/22/2014 at approximately 1935 hours, Inmate David Courtney passed away at the Columbia Conroe Regional Hospital after being hospitalized for approximately 25 days. I/M Courtney's death was ruled a natural death as a result of Acquired Immune Deficiency Syndrome.

During my initial review, it was discovered that there were some inconsistencies in the medical documentation submitted by county officials. The following is a chronological listing of events by medical staff and course of action taken:

August 20, 2014 – Inmate seen by medical staff for checkup.

September 6, 2014 - Inmate presents to medical complaining of blood in stool.

September 16, 2014 - Inmate presents to medical complaining of blood in stool and abdominal pain. He was evaluated by a medic and referred to clinic.

October 25, 2014 - Inmate presents to medical complaining of blood in stool and abdominal pain at 6am, is seen by the medic and is referred to clinic. At 10am, inmate makes the same medical complaints as he did at 6am and this time, he is referred to see a doctor.

October 31, 2014 - Inmate is seen by doctor at 1pm in the afternoon. This is 55 days after his first complaint of passing blood in his stool. This is also the first documentation that shows a referral being followed-up on for the inmate.

Medical staff failed to follow-up on referrals for treatment for the inmate in a timely manner. The administration will need to provide a plan of action outlining corrective measures to prevent future occurrences.

A notice of non-compliance was issued on February 9, 2015 in regards to lack of referral follow-up and not providing efficient care for acute situations as required.







Thank you for contacting us regarding your investigation. Correct Care Solutions takes any death of a patient very seriously and each is given an in depth review by members of each our clinical and operations staff. This internal review is supplemental to that required by Rule §269.1.

While our review is still ongoing, we recognize that there were opportunities for improvement on the care provided to Mr. Courtney. His complaints while at the Montgomery County Jail were primarily gastrointestinal until the end of November, at which time he began complaining of respiratory difficulties and we sent him to the hospital. The respiratory issues, coupled with his long term failure to address his HIV diagnosis, was what ultimately lead to his death

We are working diligently to increase our staffing above the current staffing matrix at the Montgomery County Jail. This includes bringing in additional registered nurses who are already scheduled to be onsite as well as adding midlevel provider hours to provide increased access to care.



Correct Care Solutions has continued to investigate the care provided to Mr. Courtney. In response to your question, we do not find any evidence that Mr. Courtney saw a physician at the Montgomery County Jail prior to October 31, 2014.

As previously mentioned, we are working to increase staffing at the facility. Additionally, CCS has instituted new policies and procedures with added levels of oversight and backstops to ensure that all individuals are properly referred to providers, are seen by the providers and receive necessary lab work and specialty care when indicated.
