





NOTIFICATION OF THE DECISION OF AN ADMINISTRATIVE REVIEW BOARD ICO ISN 263 TO CONTINUE DETENTION

An Administrative Review Board has reviewed the information about you that was talked about at the meeting on 13 June 2007 and the deciding official in the United States has made a decision about what will happen to you.

You will continue to be detained. You will have another meeting in the future to decide if you are still a threat to the United States and its friends or if there is any other reason to keep you here. At the next meeting to review your case, the Board will consider all the information it has about you, including anything you tell them at the meeting, how you have been acting, if you are obeying the camp rules, if you are working with the United States government trying to help, and if you still want to wage jihad against Americans and their friends. The Board will also look at written statements, if any are provided, from you, your family, and your friends. We recommend that you write to your family and friends and ask them to send you written statements that will help show the Board that you are not dangerous to Americans and their friends. If the Board thinks you no longer pose a threat to the security of Americans and their friends, it will suggest to the deciding official in the United States that you be transferred or released from Guantanamo Bay. The deciding official in the United States makes the final decision.

The AMO received written confirmation from the JDG liaison stating the documents were accepted by the detainee.



1. (U) Introduction

a. (U) An Administrative Review Board (ARB) was held pertaining to the subject Enemy Combatant (EC). In reaching the ARB's conclusions and recommendations, the ARB considered both classified and unclassified information. The following record of the proceedings presents the factors the ARB used in making its recommendation.

2. (U) Synopsis of Proceedings

- a. (U) The detainee declined to attend the ARB, and consequently the Board convened without the detainee being present.
- b. (U) The Designated Military Officer (DMO) presented the Unclassified Summary in both written and oral form.
- c. (U) The Assisting Military Officer (AMO) presented the Notification of the Decision of an ARB as Exhibit EC-A, identified herein as enclosure (2). The AMO then presented the Enemy Combatant Election Form as Exhibit EC-B, identified herein as enclosure (3). Exhibit EC-B indicated the detainee was uncooperative or unresponsive and refused to leave his cell to attend the interview.
- d. (U) The ARB confirmed the Joint Detention Group (JDG) hand carried to the original English and Arabic Unclassified Summary of Evidence to the detainee. The AMO received a written confirmation of delivery of the documents to the detainee from the JDG.
- f. (U) The unclassified portion of the proceedings was adjourned. The ARB convened the classified session and the DMO presented the Classified Summary. The ARB panel members reviewed the classified exhibits and closed the session for deliberation.
- g. (U) The ARB has complied with the Detainee Treatment Act of 2005. In making a determination of status or disposition of this detainee, the ARB has assessed, to the extent practicable, whether any statement derived from or relating to this detainee was obtained as a result of coercion; and the probative value, if any, of any such statement. In addition, any new evidence that became available relating to the enemy combatant status of this detainee was considered.

An Administrative Review Board has reviewed the information about you that was talked about at the meeting on 27 December 2007 and the deciding official in the United States has made a decision about what will happen to you.

You will continue to be detained and you continue to be classified as an enemy combatant. You will have another meeting in the future to decide if you are still a threat to the United States and its friends or if there is any other reason to keep you here. At the next meeting to review your case, the Board will consider all the information it has about you, including anything you tell them at the meeting, how you have been acting, if you are obeying the camp rules, if you are working with the United States government trying to help, and if you still want to wage jihad against Americans and their friends. The Board will also look at written statements, if any are provided, from you, your family, and your friends. We recommend that you write to your family and friends and ask them to send you written statements that will help show the Board that you are not dangerous to Americans and their friends. If the Board thinks you no longer pose a threat to the security of Americans and their friends, it will suggest to the deciding official in the United States that you be transferred or released from Guantanamo Bay. The deciding official in the United States makes the final decision only with regard to whether or not you pose a threat to the United States. The deciding official does not review your status as an enemy combatant.

When asked if he wanted to attend the ARB, present a written or oral statement, or have the AMO speak on his behalf, the detainee stated he would not attend the ARB, however, he stated he did want the AMO to present on his behalf documents previously submitted to the board two years ago. The detainee was polite and attentive throughout the interview. A copy of both the English and Arabic translated Unclassified Summary of Evidence, were handed to the detainee according to the JDG Standard Operating Procedures.

1. (U) Introduction

a. (U) An Administrative Review Board (ARB) was held pertaining to the subject Enemy Combatant (EC). In reaching the ARB's conclusions and recommendations, the ARB considered both classified and unclassified information. The following record of the proceedings presents the factors the ARB used in making its recommendation.

2. (U) Synopsis of Proceedings

- a. (U) The detainee declined to attend the ARB, and consequently the Board convened without the detainee being present.
- b. (U) The Designated Military Officer (DMO) presented the Unclassified Summary in both written and oral form.
- c. (U) The Assisting Military Officer (AMO) presented the Notification of the Decision of an ARB as Exhibit EC-A, identified herein as enclosure (2). The AMO then presented the Enemy Combatant Election Form as Exhibit EC-B, identified herein as enclosure (3). Exhibit EC-B indicated the detainee affirmatively declined to appear personally in the ARB proceedings. The AMO verbally summarized comments the detainee made during the AMO's interview, and provided an oral statement made by the detainee to the AMO during the interview. This statement is documented in Exhibit EC-B. The AMO further presented correspondence from the detainee as Exhibit EC-C, identified herein as enclosure (4).
- d. (U) The ARB confirmed a translator who spoke the same language as the detainee was present during the AMO's interview. Additionally, the ARB confirmed the Unclassified Summary of Evidence was read and translated to the detainee, and the detainee understood the process.
- e. (U) The AMO responded verbally, on behalf of the detainee, to an allegation under the category of Training and two allegations under the category of Other Relevant Data in the Unclassified Summary.

g. (U) The unclassified portion of the proceedings was adjourned. The ARB convened the classified session and the DMO presented the Classified Summary. The ARB panel members reviewed the classified exhibits and closed the session for deliberation.



Designated Foreign Terrorist Organizations

The following descriptive list constitutes the 36 terrorist groups that currently (as of 30 January 2003) are designated by the Secretary of State as Foreign Terrorist Organizations (FTOs), pursuant to section 219 of the Immigration and Nationality Act, as amended by the Antiterrorism and Effective Death Penalty Act of 1996. The designations carry legal consequences:

- It is unlawful to provide funds or other material support to a designated FTO.
- Representatives and certain members of a designated FTO can be denied visas or excluded from the United States.
- US financial institutions must block funds of designated FTOs and their agents and must report the blockage to the US Department of the Treasury.

1. Abu Nidal organization (ANO)

a.k.a. Fatah - the Revolutionary Council, Arab Revolutionary Brigades, Black September, and Revolutionary Organization of Socialist Muslims

Description

Has carried out terrorist attacks in 20 countries, killing or injuring almost 900 persons. Targets include the United States, the United Kingdom, France, Israel, moderate Palestinians, the PLO, and various Arab countries. Major attacks included the Rome and Vienna airports in December 1985, the Neve Shalom synagogue in Istanbul and the Pan Am Flight 73 hijacking in Karachi in September 1986, and the City of Poros day-excursion ship attack in Greece in July 1988. Suspected of assassinating PLO deputy chief Abu Iyad and PLO security chief Abu Hul in Tunis in January 1991. ANO assassinated a Jordanian diplomat in Lebanon in January 1994 and has been linked to the killing of the PLO representative there. Has not staged a major attack against Western targets since the late 1980s.

Strength

Few hundred plus limited overseas support structure.

Location/Area of Operation

Elements relocated to Iraq in December 1998, where the group maintains a presence. Has an operational presence in Lebanon including in several Palestinian refugee camps. Authorities shut down the ANO's operations in Libya and Egypt in 1999. Has demonstrated ability to operate over wide area, including the Middle East, Asia, and Europe. Financial problems and internal disorganization have reduced the group's activities and capabilities.

including US citizens. Several of the arrested militants have reportedly undergone military training in Afghanistan, and some fought with the Afghan mujahidin during the war against the former Soviet Union. Others are alleged to have ties to Islamic extremist organizations in Indonesia and the Philippines.

Strength

Malaysian police assess the KMM to have 70 to 80 members. The Malaysian police continued to investigate more than 200 suspected Muslim militants throughout 2002.

Location/Area of Operation

The KMM is reported to have networks in the Malaysian states of Perak, Johor, Kedah, Selangor, Terengganu, and Kelantan. They also operate in Wilayah Persukutuan, the federal territory comprising Kuala Lumpur. According to press reports, the KMM has ties to radical Indonesian Islamic groups and has sent members to Ambon, Indonesia, to fight against Christians.

External Aid

Largely unknown, probably self-financing.

59. Libyan Islamic Fighting Group

a.k.a. Al-Jam'a al-isiamiyyah al-Muqatilah, Fighting Islamic Group, Libyan Fighting Group, Libyan Islamic Group

Description

Emerged in 1995 among Libyans who had fought against Soviet forces in Afghanistan.

Declared the government of Libyan leader Muammar Qadhafi un-Islamic and pledged to overthrow it. Some members maintain a strictly anti-Qadhafi focus and organize against Libyan Government interests, but others are aligned with Usama Bin Ladin's al-Qaeda organization or are active in the international mujahidin network. The group was designated for asset freeze under E.0.13224 and UNSCR 1333 in September 2001.

Activities

Claimed responsibility for a failed assassination attempt against Qadhafi in 1996 and engaged Libyan security forces in armed clashes during the mid-to-late 1990s. Continues to target Libyan interests and may engage in sporadic clashes with Libyan security forces.

Strength

Not known but probably has several hundred active members or supporters.



Detainee then stayed at the al-Harem al-Nabawi Mosque during the week of Ramadan. Upon arrival in Medina, SA detainee applied for admission to the University of Medina, but was not accepted. Detainee also contemplated obtaining asylum in the United Kingdom (UK), but found the process too cumbersome. Detainee remained at the al-Harem Mosque for three weeks during Ramadan, and then traveled to Damascus, Syria (SY), via Jordan, because a visa was not required. He rented a room for less than a month in the Dummar area while he applied to the University of Damascus Islamic Law Department. Detainee claimed the application was denied because he could not provide the proper documentation. During this period detainee frequently visited the Ummaid Mosque to pray. Detainee visited various European embassies in Damascus, including the UK Embassy, to inquire about a visa to Europe, but received only negative responses and was forced to travel to Sudan (SU).



RETURNED TO LIVE WITH ABU FARIS FOR 2 MONTHS OR SO. BUT ACTUALLY ENDED UP STAYING 1 YEAR. DETAINEE WAS ASKED ABOUT ABU FARIS' BROTHER RADWAN (SUPPOSEDLY A UBL MECHANIC IN REPORTING) BUT DETAINEE STATES HE HAS NO INFORMATION. DETAINEE THEN LIVED WITH THE ABOVE-MENTIONED AHMED AL LIBY IN THE SAME NEIGHBORHOOD. Detainee received his passport from Abu al-Faraj, who was possibly from Morocco or Libya, and spent 15 days in Zurmat before crossing the border into Pakistan en route to Lahore, PK. Once they reached Lahore, Ismael al-Jazaree was responsible for detainee and 12 others. Twelve days later, detainee left Lahore and went to Karachi. 
