#### CASES OF INTEREST

#### **NINTH CIRCUIT MATTERS:**

#### USA V. BOYD, ET AL

(Dist. ORE)

Inmates' appeal of District Court denial of Motion to Dismiss for Double Jepoardy in the criminal prosecution of inmates for destruction of government property during the 9/93 disturbance at FCI Sheridan, has been removed from the oral argument calendar.

#### **DISTRICT COURT MATTERS:**

Randall Scott Harvey v. Wayne Stephens, et al., CV-F-95-5055 (E.D.Cal.)

Inmate claims staff at FPC Boron forced him to commit criminal acts while incarcerated there. Allegations include stealing government property, finding a "hit" man for a contract employee, falsifying official reports, forging staff signatures, and bypassing computer security to falsify computer records. Seeks \$5,000,000 from various defendants.

#### Clifford Schuett v. BOP, et al., CV 95-3159-MMC (N.D.Cal.)

Paraplegic inmate attempts to excuse escape from CCC by stating the CCC was not properly handicap equipped. Left the CCC and turned himself in to USMS the following

day. The second time this inmate has escaped from this CCC. Sues the DHO, CCM and Regional Director.

#### USA v. Wesley Wade Hunter

Possession of 19 grams of tar heroin at USP Lompoc. First trial ended in hung jury (11-1 to convict). Judge ordered counsel to begin selecting jury for retrial 3 hours later. Second trial ended in hung jury (less favorable amount). Third trial scheduled, however, defendant plead to original charge on October 5, 1995.

#### USA v. Bradley John Kehm

Assault on inmate, assault on staff, possession of a weapon and destruction of government property at FCI Lompoc in 1993. Jury found inmate guilty of possession of a weapon but not guilty of attempted murder (despite 34 stab wounds in inmate victim).

#### COUPAR V. CRABTREE

(Dist. ORE)

Bivens complaint alleging staff instructed inmates to spread false information which endangered Coupar. Coupar was transferred for security reasons.

#### JACKSON V. CRABTREE

(D. OR)


