Hearings/Trials

Kurtz v. U.S. (SHE) FTCA action alleging the BOP was negligent in failing to prevent inmate from attempting to commit suicide by hanging. Inmate is permanently impaired and received compassionate release on November 18, 1998. Trial held January 26 & 27, 1999. Judge ruled from bench finding no negligence on the part of BOP.

Nelson v. Lathers (SDC) Habeas petition, CCC inmate tested positive for methamphetamine, returned to closer custody and lost 3621(e) date. Judge released inmate on "appeal bond" after indicating he believed inmate had been disciplined for use of "Vicks" inhaler. Response filed by San Diego USAO who appeared at hearing on February 26, 1999. Court refused to return inmate to custody.

<u>Awards</u>

None to report.

Settlements

Mota v. U.S. (SDC) FTCA action regarding alleged injury during escorted trip. Bench trial originally set for January 26, 1999, gave way to settlement negotiations. A settlement of \$7,500 was reached on the eve of trial.

Mawhinney v. U.S. (LOS) FTCA action alleging slip and fall from stool while accessing top bunk. Los Angeles USAO asked for \$250,000 settlement authority; BOP authorized \$100,000. Plaintiff agreed to accept 125,000 at settlement conference. Settlement of \$125,000 approved by Director March 3, 1999.

<u>U.S. v. Dahkowsky</u>, (SHE) Inmate convicted April 1, 1999, of assault with a deadly weapon and assault resulting in serious bodily injury (victim was other inmate). Sentencing scheduled for June 4, 1999. Inmate received 84 month sentence.

<u>U.S. v. Simmons</u>, (LOM) Case involved assault on correctional officer that occurred December 14, 1997. Inmate sentenced May 13, 1999, to 84 months incarceration with 3 years supervised release to follow.

<u>U.S. v. Hillard</u>, (LOM) Case involved assault of two correctional officers on October 22, 1995, during October 1995 disturbances. On June 4, 1999, inmate received four month sentence.



Romero vs. United States (PHX) FTCA wrongful death action previously reported as settled by AUSA without BOP settlement authority is revived. Plaintiff in this case, the companion of and mother of decedent's children, originally accepted the offer to settle but now has rejected the offer. AUSA is proceeding with motion to dismiss.

Two FCI Dublin FTCA administrative claims (Bazin and Wylde) currently being processed for settlement at \$45,000 and \$55,000 respectively.
