Attached is a copy of a survey the Auditor of Public Accounts staff will be completing on all Kentucky jails this year. The review period is for the year ended June 30, 2005, for financial data. For many of the questions, the jail practices of your facility as of the interview date will be utilized.

In preparation of this survey, we have consulted the Kentucky Jailer's Association, the Kentucky County Judge/Executive's Association, the Kentucky Association of Magistrates and Commissioners, the Kentucky Association of Counties, the Governor's Office for Local Development, and the Department of Corrections.

The purpose and impetus for it is:

- o Jail expenditures are a rapidly growing component of County Expenditures.
- Although the APA audits fiscal courts, which includes jail expenditures and revenue, issues and questions continue to arise regarding specific jail financial matters and practices.
- o The Department of Corrections promulgated 501 KAR 3:030 and 501 KAR 7:030 which provide for additional audit requirements of certain jail funds.
- o Unfortunately, several jails have recently experienced financial problems that further highlighted the need for expanded audit procedures.

In meeting with the previously referenced organizations, it was agreed that a uniform comprehensive compilation of jail data would be extremely beneficial to address jail operations and funding. These surveys will be shared with your local fiscal court and compiled in a report to share with the organizations previously referenced, as well as with the 2006 General Assembly.

After we complete these surveys, we will prepare an audit scope of work for the next audit year. If we determine a financial problem in the current year audit or as a result of the survey, we will follow-up as necessary.

A representative of the APA will contact you to schedule an appointment to complete the survey. Interviews will begin in mid-August and should be completed by early December of 2005. Please allow about four hours for this interview and we want to thank you for your assistance and cooperation.

We recognize that your jail is closed, however we still want to conduct this survey to determine present policies and cost information. The review period is for the year ended June 30, 2005, for financial data. For many of the questions, the jail practices of your facility as of the interview date will be utilized.

In preparation of this survey, we have consulted the Kentucky Jailer's Association, the Kentucky County Judge/Executive's Association, the Kentucky Association of Magistrates and Commissioners, the Kentucky Association of Counties, the Governor's Office for Local Development, and the Department of Corrections.

The purpose and impetus for it is:

- o Jail expenditures are a rapidly growing component of County Expenditures.
- Although the APA audits fiscal courts, which includes jail expenditures and revenue, issues and questions continue to arise regarding specific jail financial matters and practices.
- The Department of Corrections promulgated 501 KAR 3:030 and 501 KAR 7:030 which provide for additional audit requirements of certain jail funds.
- O Unfortunately, several jails have recently experienced financial problems that further highlighted the need for expanded audit procedures.

In meeting with the previously referenced organizations, it was agreed that a uniform comprehensive compilation of jail data would be extremely beneficial to address jail operations and funding. These surveys will be shared with your local fiscal court and compiled in a report to share with the organizations previously referenced, as well as with the 2006 General Assembly.

After we complete these surveys, we will prepare an audit scope of work for the next audit year. If we determine a financial problem in the current year audit or as a result of the survey, we will follow-up as necessary.
