Dear Sir,

This is a public comment for the Weight  
Petition (CC Docket #96-128).

I am incarcerated in the Texas prison sys-  
tem. My family lives in Missouri and Florida.  
Phone calls to them cost 39¢ per minute if I  
buy time from the unit commissary and 43¢ per  
minute if I call collect.

My brother in Missouri had his landline  
removed earlier this year because he could no  
longer afford the costs of my calling him.

My wife in Florida and I still talk. She  
sends me \$100 per month to buy minutes. This,  
after tax is taken out, allows me to use al-  
most half of the minutes I am permitted. In-  
mates get 500 minutes per month now. The \$100  
purchases approximately 240 minutes.


As it stands, my wife can afford to make

4 visits a year to see me. We have sacrificed one visit so that I can call her those 240 minutes per month. The only way, short of you putting an end to the price-gouging interstate rates, for me to be able to use the remainder of the phone minutes I am allotted every month, would be to sacrifice another visit.

There is no reason for these phone rates to be so high other than so the phone company can make ~~exorbitant~~ exorbitant kick-back payments to the State of Texas and still make unwarranted profits.

Please put an end to this.



Dear Chairman Genachowski:

The high cost of the telephone service discourages me to call home because a 15 minute call costs over \$5 which is economically crippling. The Penna. Department of Corrections has a classification policy to send inmates as far away from their home region as possible to discourage flow of contraband through visitors. As a result, my long distance call costs too much for regular calling to home, which separates me from my good ties to my community. I earn top pay of 42¢ per hour in prison labor and inmate accounts takes 20% of all monies and applies it towards fines and court costs by statute. Making pennies for hard labor minus deductions and necessities through the commissary, I can't call my mom to tell her that I am doing okay to calm her worries with the importance of hearing my voice.

Please consider a prisoner and their families circumstances when deciding the WRIGHT Petition, a person should be able to afford to call their mother while we are all still together here on this Earth. Thank you for your time and consideration.

I am writing to your office today in support of the Phone Justice Campaign. I am currently a Pennsylvania State Inmate who have been extradited to the State of New York to serve time. Since arriving in New York State I witness the rates drastically drop 3 different times to provide inmates with a easier way to continue the family bonding as well as reach out to reconnect. I currently pay \$1.85 for a half hour phone call from New York State to my family in Philadelphia Pa., which is considered a long distance out of state call. This is exact opposite of the outstanding rate of almost \$500 a call for 15 min. inner state to call my family while Im in Pennsylvania Dept. of Corrections. This is more then 2 times the rate and half the minuetes. Pennsylvania also charge you
