This is in reference to your Freedom of Information-Privacy Acts (FOIPA) request.

We have located approximately 13,000 pages which appear to relate to your request. Under Title 28, Code of Federal Regulations (CFR), Sections 16.11 and 16.49, there is a duplication fee of ten cents per page for every page released over 100. 
